#### Hello John. How are you?



#### **Formal and Informal Greetings**

When greeting another person in English, you should use a greeting appropriate to the relationship you have with that person. For example, you would greet your supervisor differently than you would greet a friend you see at the grocery store.



- People you know
- Casual Interaction

(Day to Day, street dialogue, etc.)



- People you don't know
- Show lots of respect
  (Dinner parties, meetings, etc.)
