## HOW MUCH...?

We use it to know the QUANTITY or AMOUNT
How much time do we have to finish the test?
How much money did you spend?
How much sugar would you like in your coffee?

## HOW MUCH + UNCOUNTABLE NOUN

> We use it to know the PRICE
How much is that painting?
How much are those shoes?

IN THIS CASE, WE CAN USE HOW MUCH WITH COUNTABLE NOUNS (BOTH SINGULAR AND PLURAL NOUNS).

## HOW MANY...?

We use it to know the QUANTITY OF something
How many days are there in January?
How many people work in your company?
How many cousins do you have?
How many books did you buy?
How many countries are there in the world?
How many students are in the class right now?
How many chairs are there in this room?
How many pieces of chocolate would you like?
