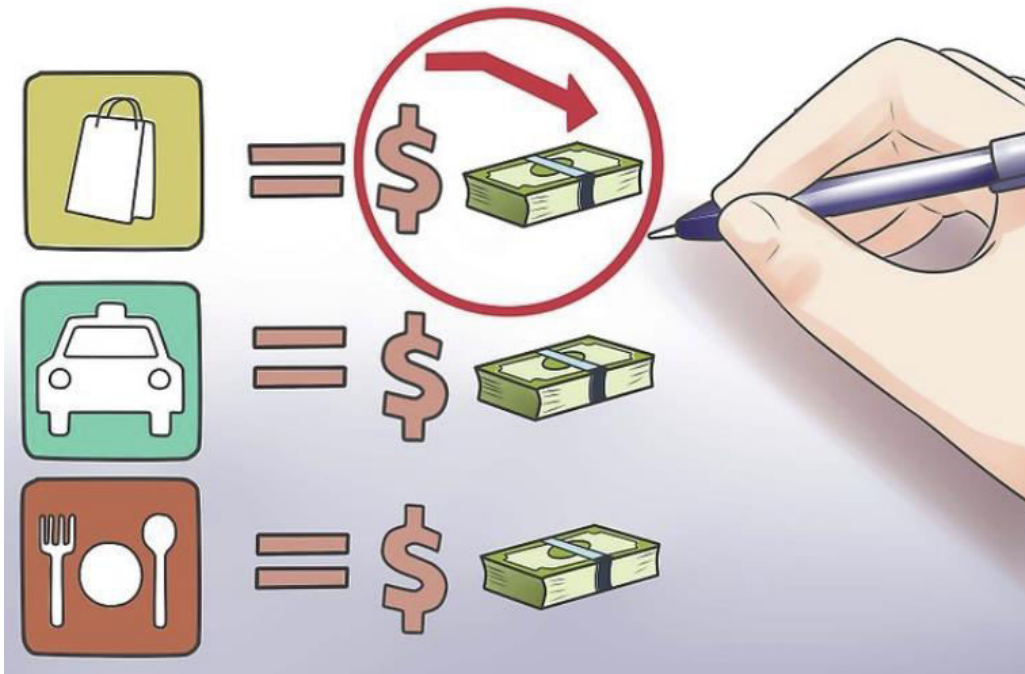

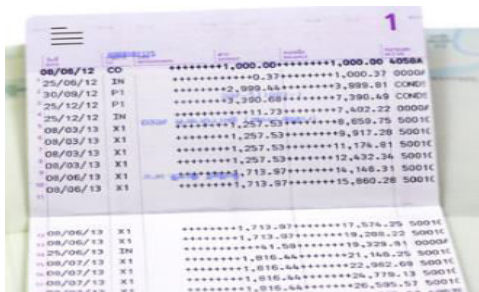

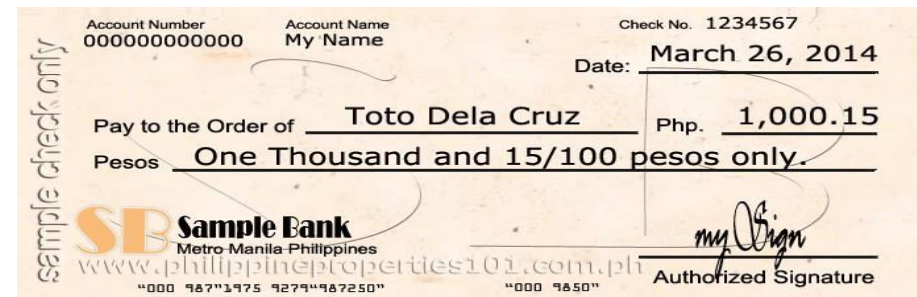

- We use it to know the PRICE

How much is that painting?

How much are those shoes?

IN THIS CASE, WE CAN USE HOW MUCH WITH COUNTABLE NOUNS (BOTH SINGULAR AND PLURAL NOUNS).

HOW MANY...?

- We use it to know the QUANTITY OF something
