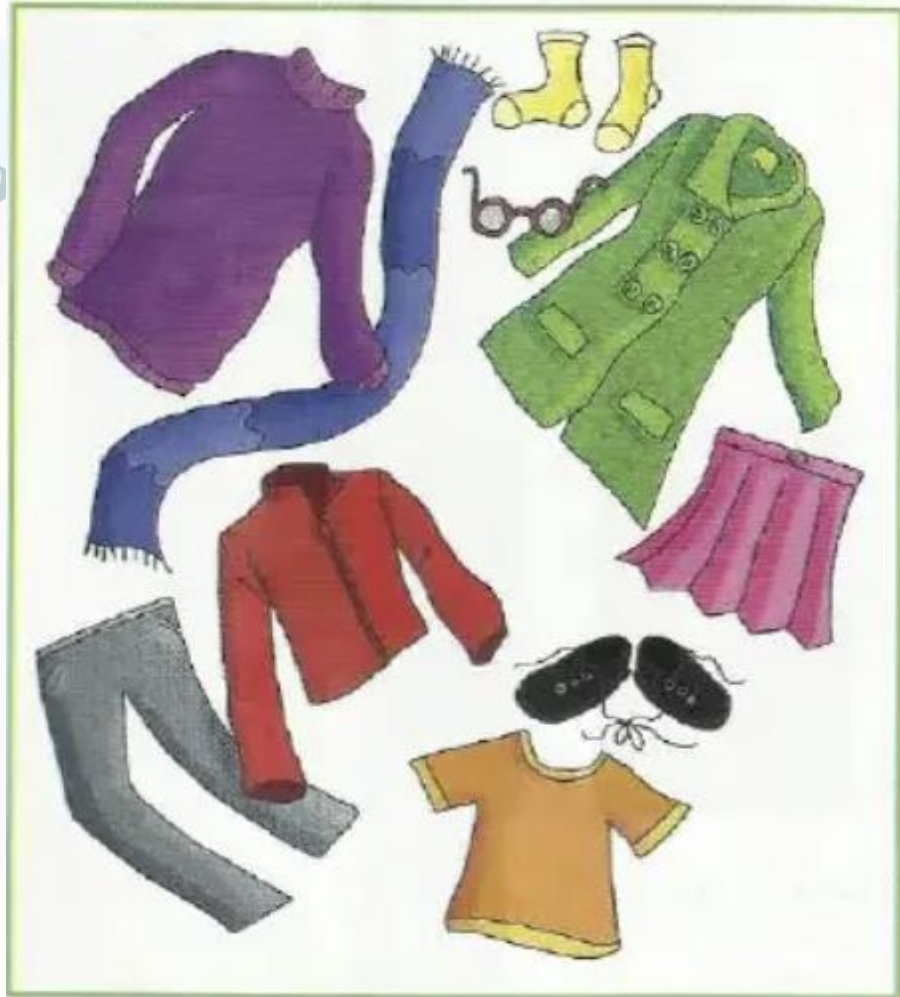

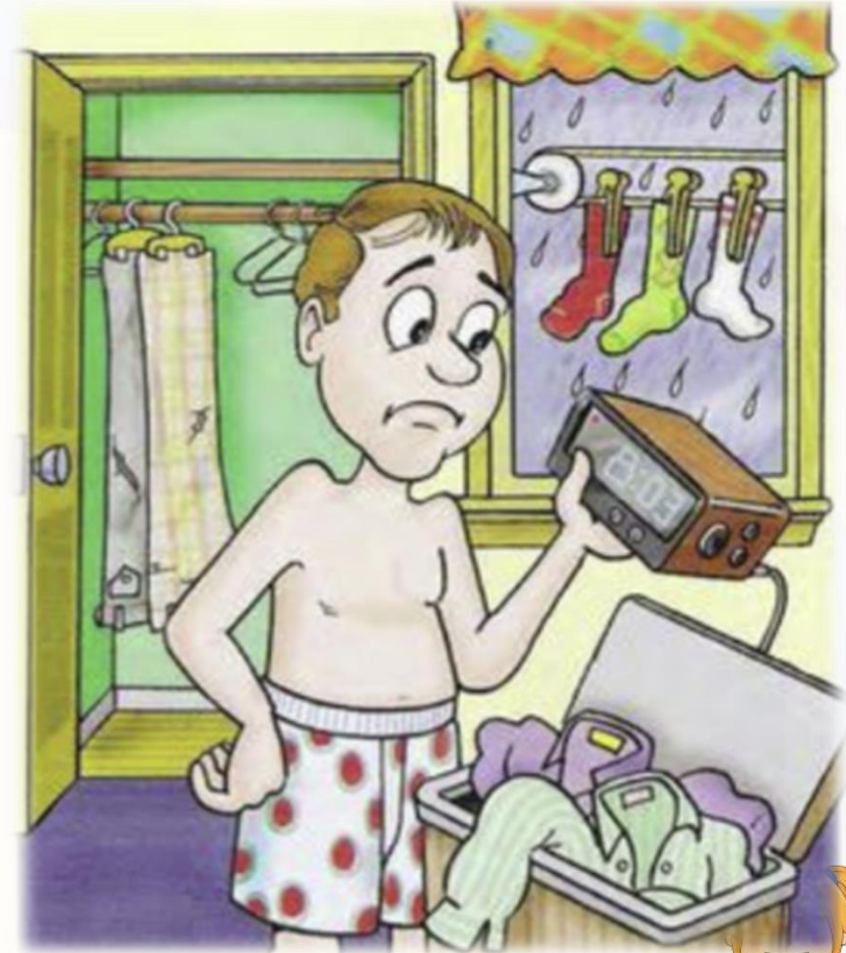


Nothing To Wear
