A room assigned to one person.



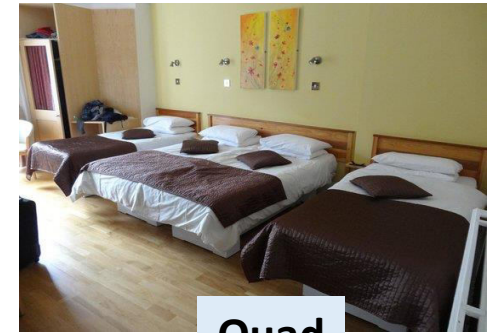
Double

A room assigned to two people.



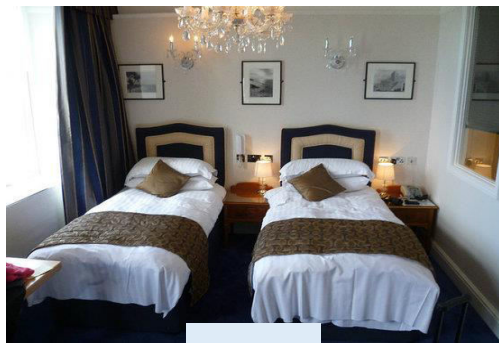
Triple

A room assigned to three people.



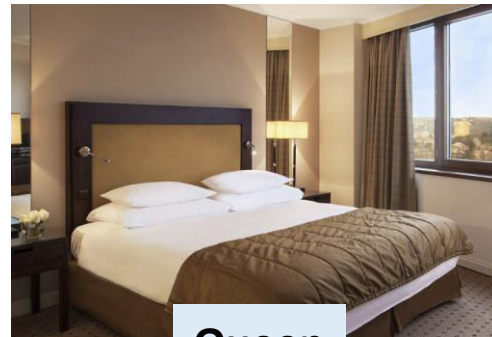
Quad

A room with two beds.



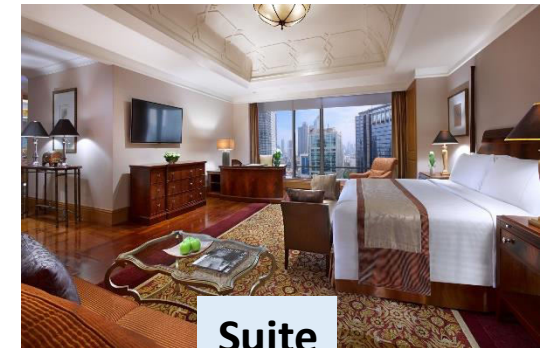
Queen

Suite

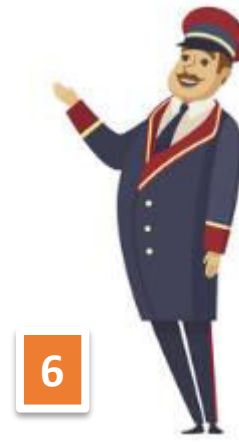
A furnished large room.

Hotel Tips

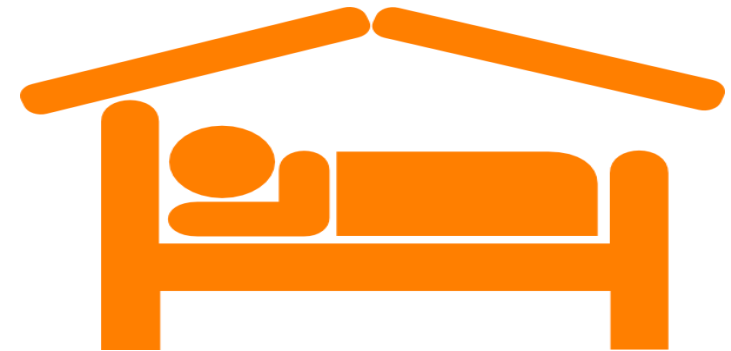
Before I go on vacation, I always make hotel reservations **in advance** so I have a place to stay. I usually look online for cheap hotels or other **accommodations**. Sometimes, I **book** a nice hotel that has a number of **amenities** like a swimming pool, exercise room, or **kitchenette**. These rooms often **come furnished** with a microwave oven and a small refrigerator. If I eat at a restaurant at the hotel, I just have the meal **billed** to the room and pay for the room charge and meals at the same time. Other times, I just look for cheap hotels or motels that provide the basic necessities. If I really want to save money, I **reserve** a bed at a **hostel**. The price is cheaper, but I have to share a room with other **customers**, which doesn't bother me at all.
