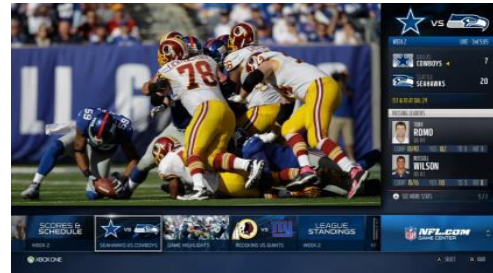

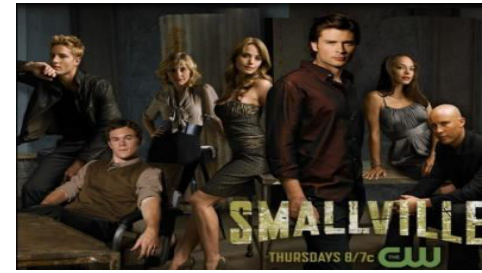

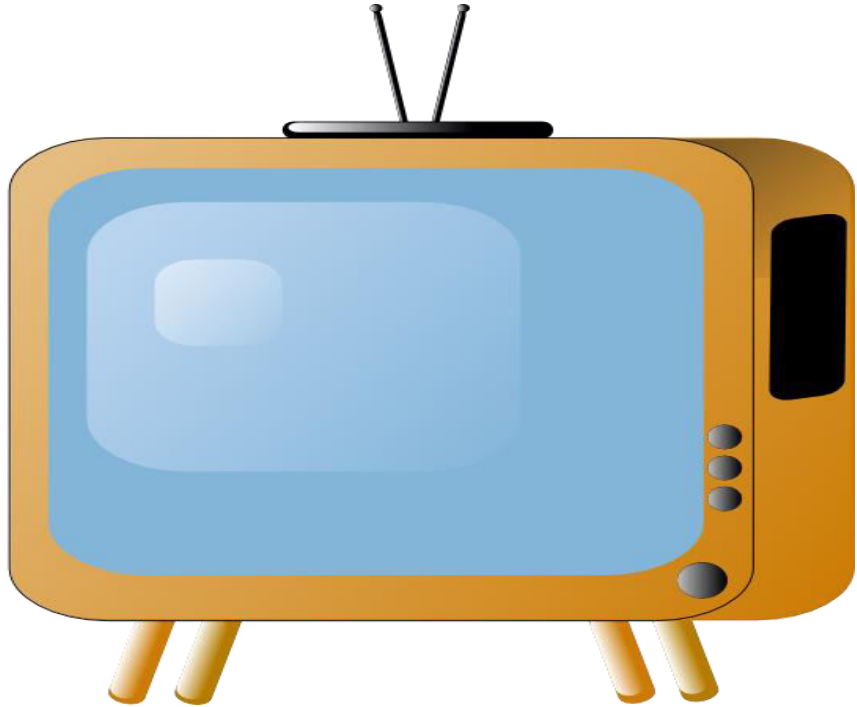

use TV wisely. He sets rules about the TV. He has two rules for Ruth. First, she can watch only one hour of TV day. Second, she can watch only planned shows.

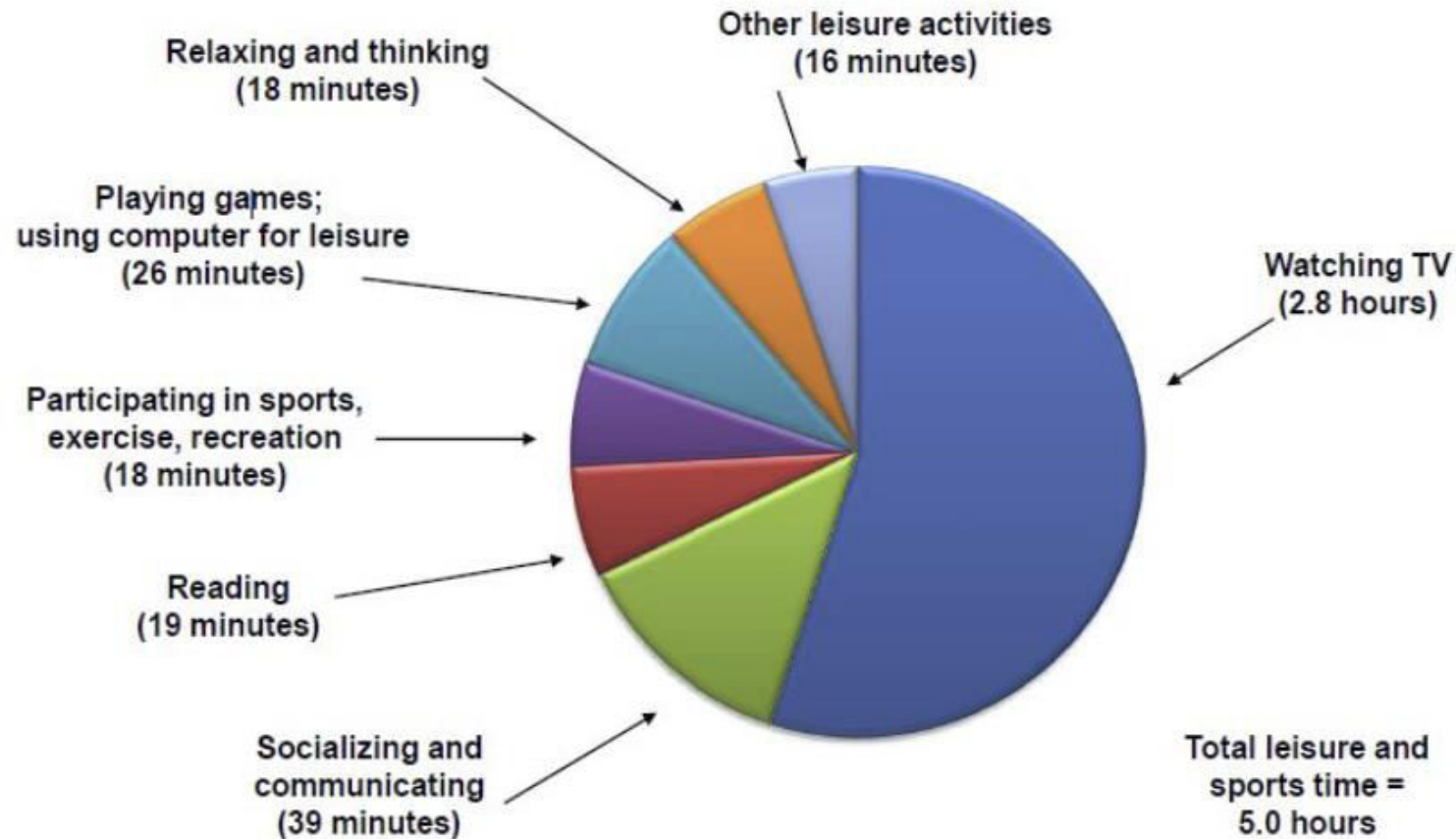

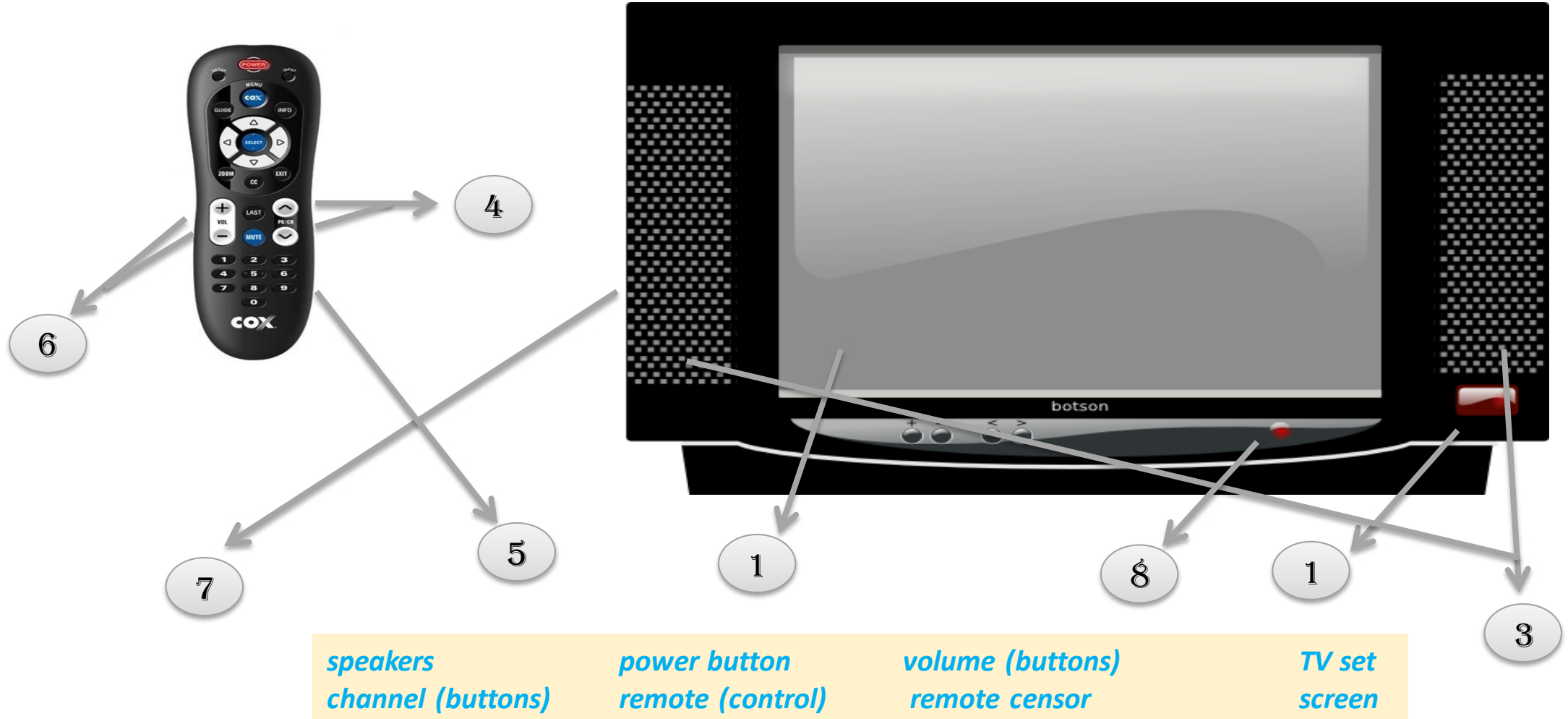
