The Beatles were one of the most famous music groups of rock. Many consider them the best musical group on Earth. They sold 1.1 billion of records. The members of the group were John Lennon, Paul McCartney, George Harrison and Ringo Starr. They were all from Liverpool England. More famous that their music were their haircuts, where were called "mop-tops". They decided to go on with their musical careers on their own. John Lennon was the one who got the most success. He wrote the worldwide famous song "Imagine", now a peace symbol. He became a peace activist more than a musician. He was killed by a madman when he was signing autographs to his fans in 1980. Today many of the Beatle's songs are still played on radio stations and many new fans listen to their songs on MP3 and I-Pods.
