# **Times of The Day**


**Time Expressions** 

### In the morning

### In the evening

- the part of each day between the end of the afternoon and the time when you go to bed.

- the part of day from noon until dinnertime or sunset.

### o'clock

- used to know the hour of the day. (according to the clock)











