



Count vs. Non Count Nouns



A count noun is one that can be expressed in plural form, usually with an "s."

A non count noun is one that usually cannot be expressed in a plural form.

Much/Many:

Much modifies only uncountable nouns.

Many modifies only countable nouns.

"We don't have much time to get this done."

"Many Americans travel to Europe."

Little/Few:

Little modifies only uncountable nouns.

Few modifies only countable nouns.

"He had <u>little</u> food in the house."

"There are few doctors in town."
